

# CELEBRATION OF SCHOLARSHIP & CREATIVE ACTIVITY

We are trying to encourage students who are not presenting at the Celebration of Scholarship and Creative Activity event to still attend. This will introduce students not active in scholarly and creative activity pursuits to the work being done by fellow students. It will also foster peer-to-peer interactions discussing academic subjects. We would like to encourage instructors to consider giving a small assignment to their students. Possible assignments include:

## Evaluation of a presentation

1. Attend an oral presentation and evaluate the speaker's performance.
2. Attend a poster presentation and evaluate the design and effectiveness of the poster.
3. Attend a performance, film or visual art presentation and evaluate the work, identifying themes and concepts discussed in class.

## Course content

4. Attend a poster or oral presentation related to the course material and connect the results presented by the student to a theory or concept discussed in class.
5. Attend a poster or oral presentation related to the course material and ask the presenter a question. Record both the question you asked and their response.
6. Attend two posters or oral presentations on different topics. Write a creative story that links these two topics together.

## Data analysis

7. Attend a poster presentation that includes a graph. Redraw this graph and use it to explain the dependent and independent variables, the type of analysis performed, and any conclusions that were drawn. Could the data have been displayed more effectively?
8. Attend a poster presentation that includes statistical analysis of data. Summarize the data and the type of statistical analysis used. What conclusions were drawn? Was the statistical analysis performed correctly?
9. Attend a poster presentation or oral presentation that uses survey data. Were the questions being asked qualitative or quantitative? Was the sample size large enough to support the conclusions? Was any statistical analysis performed and, if so, was it done correctly?
